## Cameras Deliver Discreet Surveillance

Bosch WZ16 and WZ18 Integrated Infrared Bullet Cameras help staff at the Pittsburgh Zoo & PPG Aquarium monitor select groups of animals, including polar bears, elephants and tigers. Providing reliable, high-performance day and night surveillance, the cameras helped zoo staff keep a “baby watch” over pregnant elephants without adding visible light that would disturb the animals.

## Problem: Zoo Staff Need a Method for Monitoring Animals Day and Night

- Surveillance equipment is essential for security and monitoring of large zoo animals
- Nighttime imaging must be effective without disturbing the animals' habitats
- Vivid color video required to feed live zoo cam used in partnership with local CBS affiliate

## Solution: Bosch Integrated Infrared Bullet Cameras

- WZ16 and WZ18 cameras deliver vivid color images during the day
- Integrated LEDs provide 60 feet of high-performance night vision under low light conditions
- Compact design allows for discrete surveillance

## Results: Improved Awareness of Animal Activity

- Cameras used during “baby watch” helped zoo capture two elephant births on video
- Staff can monitor safety and security of animals at night without added lighting
- Cameras feed video of polar bears to CBS’ live zoo cam
